

7 Simple Steps to Check Safety Before the Lighting Team Arrives



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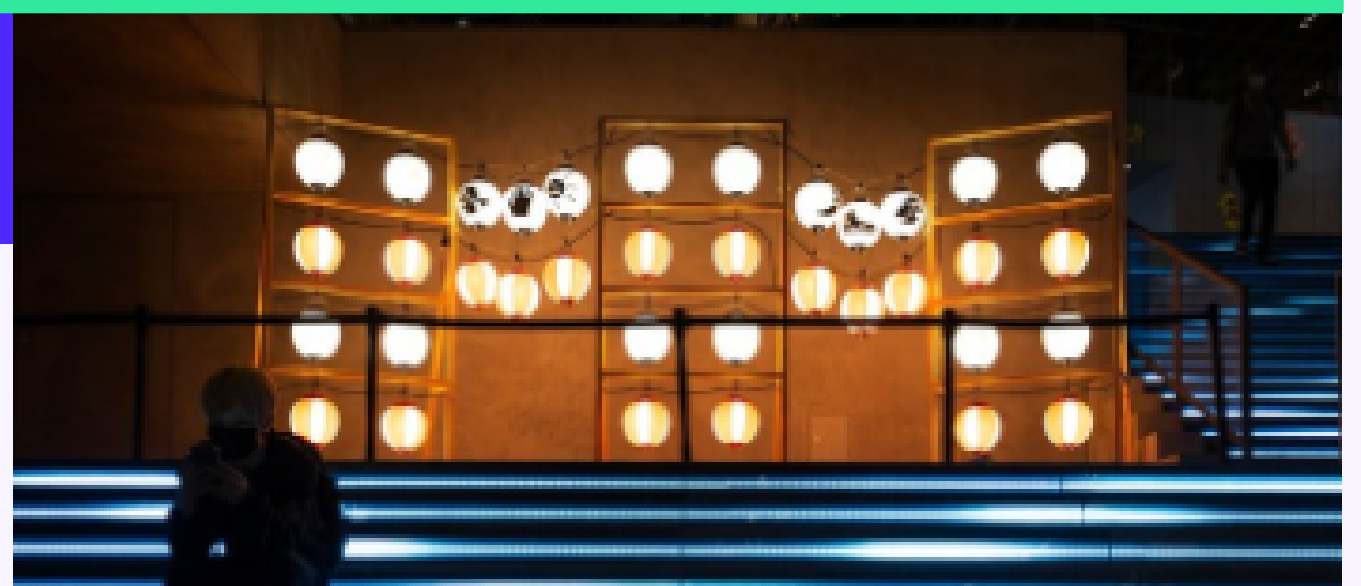
Understand Your Event Needs

Know the type of event, how many people will attend, and how long it will last. This helps you plan for safety and avoid surprises.

Inspect the Venue

Walk through the venue and look for anything unsafe, like loose wires or unstable structures. Check the condition of stages, ceilings, and other areas where lights might be installed.

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Clear Emergency Exits

Make sure emergency exits and fire alarms are easy to find and not blocked by furniture, decorations, or equipment.

Check Maximum Capacity

Find out how many people the venue can hold safely. Don't let it get too crowded, as this can make it hard to exit in an emergency.

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Plan for Secure Installations

Test Power Sources

Check with the venue to ensure their power service is working and suitable for the AV and Lighting company.

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Have a Backup Plan
