

Matt Hixson dropped a Q post about Kash that contained a link to an article about Rod Rosenstein's threat to subpoena him.


Kash responded with a comment about Rosenstein.







U.S. launching thousands of cyber attacks on Russia, Kremlin claims

Russia accused the United States on Tuesday of leading a massive campaign of "cyber aggression" behind hundreds of thousands of <u>malicious attacks</u> a day while Russia has troops in Ukraine.

The foreign ministry said media, critical infrastructure and life support systems had been targeted, with the unprecedented scale pointing at <u>U.S.</u> and NATO-trained special forces as well as hackers acting on behalf of Kyiv's western sponsors.

"The sources of attacks will be identified and the attackers will inevitably be held accountable for their actions in accordance with the law," the Russian statement said.

NBC News reported last month that U.S. President Joe Biden had been presented with options that included disrupting Russia's internet, power and railroad switches. But the White House said that was "wildly off base."

Biden has said Russia may be planning a cyber attack against the United States, but the Kremlin has denied that.

The foreign ministry said it believed Ukraine's government, which in February announced the formation of an "IT army," was involved and had launched an "offensive cyber force."

The cybersecurity arm of Russia's telecoms firm Rostelecom and Russia's digital ministry have both reported cyber attacks.

FBI says Russian hackers scanning U.S. energy systems and pose 'current' threat

WASHINGTON, March 29 (Reuters) - Russian hackers have been scanning the systems of energy companies and other critical infrastructure in the United States, and state-sponsored hacking by Russia presents a "current" threat to American national security, a top FBI official told lawmakers on Tuesday.

"The threat from Russia in a criminal sense, in the nation state sense, is very, very real - and current," said Bryan Vorndran, an assistant director in the FBI's cyber division, during a hearing before a U.S. House of Representatives panel.

In the weeks since Russia's unprovoked attack against Ukraine, the White House and the Justice Department have been warning U.S. companies about intelligence suggesting that Russia has been taking early steps toward possibly launching cyberattacks.

Vorndran told lawmakers that "instances of Russian scanning" networks in the U.S. energy sector have increased recently, and he said such activity represents a "reconnaissance phase" by Russia to try and understand a company's defenses and whether it has vulnerabilities that could be exploited.

"It's an extremely important part of the overall attacks," he noted, adding later in his testimony that Russia represents "one of the two most capable cyber adversaries we face globally," and is "a formidable foe."

Last year, well before Russia's attack on Ukraine, U.S. President Joe Biden openly warned Russian President Vladimir Putin that certain critical infrastructure should be "off-limits" to cyberattacks.

That warning applied to 16 different kinds of infrastructure - an apparent reference to the 16 sectors designated as critical by the U.S. Homeland Security Department, including telecommunications, healthcare, food and energy.

Since that time Vorndran told lawmakers he was aware of software companies, among others who have been targeted with attacks.

"There are compromises against some of those 16 critical infrastructure sectors," he said. "I can't speak specifically to which ones."



I've noted before that @q's first post was a meme of Chernobyl that was posted a week before Russian troops seized control of it. The next post by @q was a meme of Vladimir Putin with a

caption suggesting World Warr III would be conducted in the cyberdomain.



The timestamp from <u>qagg.news</u> shows this meme was posted on February 12th, 2022.



Russia first recognized the independence of two provinces in Ukraine on February 21st and did not send troops in until February 24th.

21 February

At 22:35 (UTC+3),^[4] Russian President Vladimir Putin announced that Russia recognizes the independence of two pro-Russian breakaway regions in eastern Ukraine.^[5] This led to a first round of economic sanctions from NATO countries the following day.

In his televised speech before the announcement, Putin laid out that he believed that Vladimir Lenin was the "author and architect" of Ukraine and labeled Ukrainians who have taken down Lenin's monuments "ungrateful descendants", saying "This is what they call decommunization. Do you want decommunization? Well, that suits us just fine. But it is unnecessary, as they say, to stop halfway. We are ready to show you what real decommunization means for Ukraine." [6]


24 February

Shortly before 06:00 Moscow Time (UTC+3) on 24 February, Putin announced that he had made the decision to launch a "special military operation" in eastern Ukraine. [7][8] In his address, Putin claimed there were no plans to occupy Ukrainian territory and that he supported the right of the peoples of Ukraine to self-determination. [9] Putin also stated that Russia sought the "demilitarisation and denazification" of Ukraine. [10][11] He said that "all responsibility for possible bloodshed will be entirely on the conscience of the regime ruling on the territory of Ukraine. "[12] The Russian Ministry of Defence asked air traffic control units of Ukraine to stop flights, and the airspace over Ukraine was restricted to non-civilian air traffic, and the whole area was deemed an active conflict zone by the European Union Aviation Safety Agency. [13][14]

Did @q know weeks in advance that the war in Ukraine would turn into a cyberwar?

Although the deep state would love a full-scale kinetic war, I don't think they're going to get what they want. I would not be surprised if we see temporary internet disruptions and power outages.
