VERDICT AS TO SENTENCE

We, the jury, find as follows as to the Defendant, PATRICK MCDOWELL, in this case:

A. Aggravating Factors:

We, the jury, unanimously find that the State has proven the following Aggravating Factors beyond a reasonable doubt as to the Defendant PATRICK MCDOWELL, in this case:

1. PATRICK MCDOWELL was previously convicted of a felony and was on felony probation at the time he committed the First Degree Murder in this case

If you answer YES to at least one of the aggravating factors listed above, please proceed to Section B.

If you answered NO to every aggravating factor listed above, do not proceed to Section B; the Defendant PATRICK MCDOWELL, is not eligible for the death penalty and will be sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole. Please sign and date the verdict form and return it to the courtroom.

B. Weighing Process

Having unanimously found that at least one aggravating factor has been established beyond a reasonable doubt in Section A above and having conducted the weighing process as instructed which requires determining whether sufficient aggravating factors exist and whether those aggravating factors outweigh the mitigating circumstances before making an individual decision as to the sentence, we, the jury, by the indicated vote and number, find that the Defendant, PATRICK MCDOWELL, should be sentenced as follows:

Indicate the number of jurors for Life Imprisonment Without the Possibility of Parole 1

Indicate the number of jurors for Death 11

We, the jury, understand that if there are eight (8) or more votes for death, then the jury's recommendation is for a sentence of death and if there are fewer than eight (8) votes for death then the jury's recommendation is for a sentence of life without the possibility of parole.
