We spend most of our time here and we are just a phone call/text away should you ever need anything.

On a quiet and blistery morning in February 2017, while sipping espresso across the street at Homestyle, we noticed a crew putting up signs that read "REAL ESTATE AUCTION" at the All Season's Motel. Despite working/living across the street for two years, we'd never set foot inside. Our curiosity was undeniably piqued. We crossed Main Street to take ourselves on an unguided tour of the motel. It was an intimidating endeavor. The motel was run down, stinky, outdated, and somber. Walking around, we joked that we'd check out the auction, and bid up to the amount we were willing to pay for the parking lot.

For the love of parking, and in the spirit of fun, Justin didn't hesitate to raise his paddle to start the bidding war. When Justin's paddle went up, with the exception of the heckling auctioneer, there were crickets. The fun bidding war we anticipated never happened. Finally, along with our blood pressures, another paddle was raised. The auctioneer poked and prodded, figuring at least one of us was either competitive or crazy. He went nose to nose with Justin, and yelled, "I have a car that's worth more than your bid!"

Justin laughed, raised his paddle faster than anyone could slap it down, and that was that. We were the proud owners of our dream parking lot, along with a 13-room motel!

We spent one year renovating this 200 year old building back into a quintessential Vermont motel with a modern twist and a killer bar. LOCAL VERMONT GEMS

The sleepy town of Ludlow has a shocking amount of amazing activities within its mountains and lakes. The following categories of information can be supplemented by visiting www.yourplaceinvermont.com. This website is packed full of great information, and can guide you through Ludlow and its neighboring towns. Below we have provided our personal favorites, but there are many other options online. Enjoy all that Vermont has to offer while you're here (or just enjoy a few things and come back next weekend)!

Jackson Gore Music Series

Another one of our summer staples is the music series held on Friday evenings at Jackson Gore in the courtyard behind the hotel. After grabbing some local food at the Farmers Market, head up to the hotel for wonderful music in the hills for a gorgeous family fun experience. And, it's free!

Adventure Zone

Also located behind the Jackson Gore Resort, Okemo's Adventure Zone offers a variety of activities for everyone. It has everything from mini golf, segway tours, and disc golf course to a mountain coaster, air bag/bungee jump, and ropes course.

Fox Run Golf Club / Nordic Center

Fox Run Golf Club is one of the top rated golf courses in the state and is open to the public. The course offers scenic views of the mountain as well as surrounding forests. Play a round of 9 or 18, or 27 for that fact. There is also a family fore course out behind the driving range you can sign up for. During the winter months, Fox Run Golf Course becomes Okemo Mountain Nordic Center. They have snowshoe and cross country trails as well as a rental shop on site. No dogs allowed and passes must be purchased prior to use.

Weston Playhouse (17 min drive)

Another venue outside of the main locale, Weston Playhouse is another option on the to/from route. The Weston Playhouse Theater Company is a historic landmark located in Weston, VT that has provided an amazing lineup of shows throughout the summers for years, spanning several decades. There are always several shows each summer season and productions have included everything from Oklahoma! to The Full Monty to The King and I and Of Mice and Men.

Calvin Coolidge Homestead, Plymouth (20 min drive)

Technically located in Plymouth, VT, the Calvin Coolidge Homestead is an awesome detour on the way to and from Woodstock and/or Quechee. This is the heritage site of the nation's 30th president, and provides a unique educational experience while enjoying the rural New England visage; this is even where Coolidge himself was actually sworn in as President. Buildings include the cheese shop (Plymouth Cheese!), general store, and his birthplace farmstead.

Fletcher Farm

If you know ahead of time when you'll be visiting Ludlow, see if you can sign up for any of the classes offered at Fletcher Farm. This historic site has been part of the educational and agricultural history of Vermont for years and the classes they offer include everything from painting and drawing to jewelry making and metalworking.

Fletcher Memorial Library

Named for the same local historic namesake above, Fletcher Memorial Library is a beautiful quaint brick library located just south of the town center. With plenty of events for kids and families, it is a joyous little locale.

Book Nook & Russ Hurlburt Photography

To actually take home some great reading material and/or local art, check out the Book Nook, an independent bookstore on Main Street, and Russ Hurlburt Photography on Depot Street just next to Ludlow Town Hall. Russ Hurlburt is a local photographer with a keen eye for the natural beauty that surrounds us. He even taught for several years as the photography instructor at the Okemo Mountain School.

Ludlow Community Center

To support a local resource, check out the Ludlow Community Center located to the south of the high school on Main Street. The Center offers a variety of classes and activities, and regularly schedules drop in sports such as basketball and pickleball. So if you come across another rainy day and need an activity close by, chances are you can find something at the LCC. For more information please visit www.ludlow.vt.us

Montshire Museum & Science Center, Norwich (50 min drive)

The Montshire Museum of Science has been a staple for families and schools alike. The philosophy of the Montshire Museum is that hands on learning is the best educational method, and it doesn't fail to deliver on that mission. With plenty of exhibits and programming available, this museum has been able to excite and entice all learners into scientific exploration.

Green Mountain Sugar House

This adorable red roofed sugar house, just steps away from the lake's edge, makes everything from maple syrup and fudge to Maple Cremees (the most delicious maple soft serve ice cream in the world!), Vermont merchandise and unique foods and gifts.

Billings Farm, Woodstock (41 min drive)

Woodstock is known for its agriculture as well, and Billings Farm is a prime example of that agricultural savviness. With award winning livestock, horses, cattle, and sheep, all ages will be delighted. The farm is dedicated to agricultural education and offers plenty of programs to immerse yourself in for that rural heritage experience. Even just entering and walking around this vast farm offers plenty of rural exposure.

VINS Nature Center, Quechee (51 min drive)

When you're done visiting Billings Farm, keep heading east into Quechee for Vermont Institute of Natural Science. A favorite for kids for longer than we can remember, this nature center is dedicated to birds of prey specifically and offers an amazing (and safe) close encounter with these enigmatic birds. Open year round, VINS offers exhibits and classes and is an engaging experience for all who visit.

FISH

Lake Pauline, Lake Rescue and Echo Lake are home to Rainbow, Brook, and Lake Trout, Perch, Bass, and Pickerel. Lake Pauline is a lovely spot to fish. There's a little pull-off on the road (type in "16 East Lake Road, Ludlow" in your map and you'll find it! It's 2.8 miles from M+M). You can sit and fish right before the waterfall. Ask us for more fishing spots and where to get fishing equipment. Drive to Red Bridge Road to take a dip at the dam once you're through with fishing.

American Fly Fishing Museum, Manchester (44 min drive)

Vermont is no stranger to fishing. Still a favorite outdoor hobby, most local waterways are accessible for fishing, including Lake Champlain and Lake Bomoseen. This museum not only shares the history of fly fishing, but also advocates for the conservation and preservation of our natural aquatic resources.

HIKE

With a variety of hiking trails across the state, it'd be blasphemy not to traverse the natural beauties of our Green Mountain State. Offering plenty of variations, there is a little of everything from family friendly jaunts to more challenging hauls. So make sure to pack enough water and snacks and check out some of these treks!

Eliza's Favorite Running/Walking/Snowshoeing/Cross Country Skiing Route

Directly from M+M: walk to the street, take a left and head to the only stop light in town. Take a right at the light up Depot Street. Take a right at the top of Depot Street and an IMMEDIATE left into the cemetery. Follow the road all the way through the cemetery until you come to a gate. Go around the gate into a trail. Follow this trail until it comes to a dirt road. Turn right onto the dirt road and continue on the trail to a little cul de sac. STAY RIGHT! The trail continues to the golf course. Enjoy!

Healdville Trail/Okemo, Mt. Holly (10 min drive)

Naturally, we have to suggest the trail for our own Okemo Mountain. The trailhead is located on the north side of the mountain in Mt. Holly and climbs up nearly 3 miles. Another more moderate hike, it is well worth the day (morning or afternoon) to climb. With the old fire tower still in tack at the peak that visitors are allowed to climb at their own risk (don't worry it's not the original, it's a sturdy remodel), it offers yet another spectacular view of the Green Mountains. *Spoiler alert - you can also drive up the access road on the main part of the mountain called Mountain Road in the summer to reach the fire tower.

Echo Lake Vista Trail, Plymouth (11 min drive)

Combine a beach day with a mini hike and check out the Echo Lake Vista Trail located right across from the parking area for Plymouth State Park at Echo Lake. An easy walk for both kids and dogs, this trail is a beautiful stroll through the Plymouth hills that once witnessed a modest Gold Rush over a hundred years ago. Far enough from the main roads and town centers, it still sounds like you could be a hundred years in the past long before cell phones and social media existed. *Please note, dogs are not allowed on the beach.

White Rocks, Wallingford (24 min drive)

For a family friendly view, take the shortened Cliff Trail to the White Rocks for the quintessential Green Mountain scene. Or take the slightly more heady hike on the full Spur Trail (only a 1.4 mile distance). Either way, it offers an accessible hike for families to enjoy.

Mount Ascutney Weathersfield Trail, Perkinsville (26 min drive)

For a more moderate hike, check out the Mount Ascutney Weathersfield Trail. This hike includes a waterfall and provides a spectacular view from up high of the southern Vermont area for miles; Okemo can even be seen and vice versa from their respective peaks.

Deer's Leap, Killington (33 min drive)

Providing another moderate hike through the Green Mountains, this hike is located across the way between Pico and Killington Mountains with amazing views. Some stretches can be a little tricky, but over all this 1.9 mile hike is still accessible for families. The trailhead is right off of the parking lot for the Inn at Long Trail. Known as a popular stop for LT hikers, feel free to stop in for a drink and a bite at McGrath's Irish Pub located inside the Inn.

CYCLING

Road cycling in VT is unreal, and a great way to explore Vermont's scenery and small towns.

There are many routes available online.

Killington Resort Mountain Bike Park (36 min drive)

Mountain biking's popularity is quickly spreading and has grown more and more common over the years. As the Green Mountain State, it's only natural that this activity's availability would spike and Killington Mountain Resort has delivered the goods. With an enviable trail system, they provide mountain biking that is available whether you're a beginner or experienced cycler.

SWIM

This might be the Green Mountain State, but what outdoor haven would be complete without its share of swimming holes? Summer days get hot up here too and a refreshing swim is a necessity. Below are some of the best options to take a dip for some relief from the heat.

Spring House at Jackson Gore

The Adventure Zone at Okemo's Jackson Gore offers plenty of activities, including indoor and outdoor swimming pools. The indoor one is available year round and found on the lower level beneath the gym. The outdoor pool provides the perfect resort lounging experience. Check out the list of classes available as well.

Buttermilk Falls (7 min drive)

Located at the end of the Buttermilk Falls Road, right across from the Jackson Gore area, the cat is out of the bag about this beautiful wooded oasis. Part of Branch Brook where the original Route 103 ran alongside, Buttermilk Falls has 3 separate access points, providing several available swimming holes within this one locale. Just remember that like most other local swimming holes, this is in carry in-carry out. Help us keep Vermont clean!

Plymouth State Park (12 min drive)

Plymouth State Park has been part of the local swimming hole options for a long time. A huge mostly open area, this swimming hole provides fishing, boating, open fields, camping area, lean-tos, cabins, beach, kayak rentals, playground, and snack shack. A beautiful location on the backside of Route 100 North, one can easily pass hours lounging at this oasis. Just please note, this is carry in carry out.

Lake Bomoseen, Castleton (45 min drive)

As one of Vermont's largest lakes, Lake Bomoseen offers plenty of space for swimming, fishing and boating. In Rutland County between the towns of Castleton and Hubbardton, this swimming hole is also worth the trek for a great beach day. It is close enough to Rutland if you wish to include other activities throughout your day.

Silver Lake, Barnard (53 min drive)

Silver Lake is part of the Vermont State Parks and is situated on 84 acres of pristine land in Barnard, north of Woodstock.\ Aside from swimming, you can also boat, fish and camp here as well. Tucked away in the hills, it is worth the travel off the beaten path for a beautiful, shimmery day at the beach.

KAYAK / CANOE / PADDLE BOARD

If you have your own equipment, you can play in any water you want! There are also watercraft rentals at Tygart in Ludlow and Plymouth State Park on Echo Lake.
