

What 3 things does every great punter do?



1) EVERY GREAT PUNTER catches the snap out in front of his body. He wants to keep the ball in clear vision and close to his drop point. Allowing the ball to come in too close to the body will hide the ball from the punter's vision momentarily and will also require him to shovel the ball back out to his drop position.

2) EVERY GREAT PUNTER maintains a straight path of steps leading into his punt...No major crossing over of steps and no last second turns of his hips. He envisions a narrow alley that he walks down, the alley matches his target line. This is extremely important when directional punting.

3) EVERY GREAT PUNTER has extreme focus and concentration on the drop. The **BIG KEY** is getting the ball onto the power-line and dropping it with careful intent to insure the ball remains in the exact position until the punting foot makes contact.
