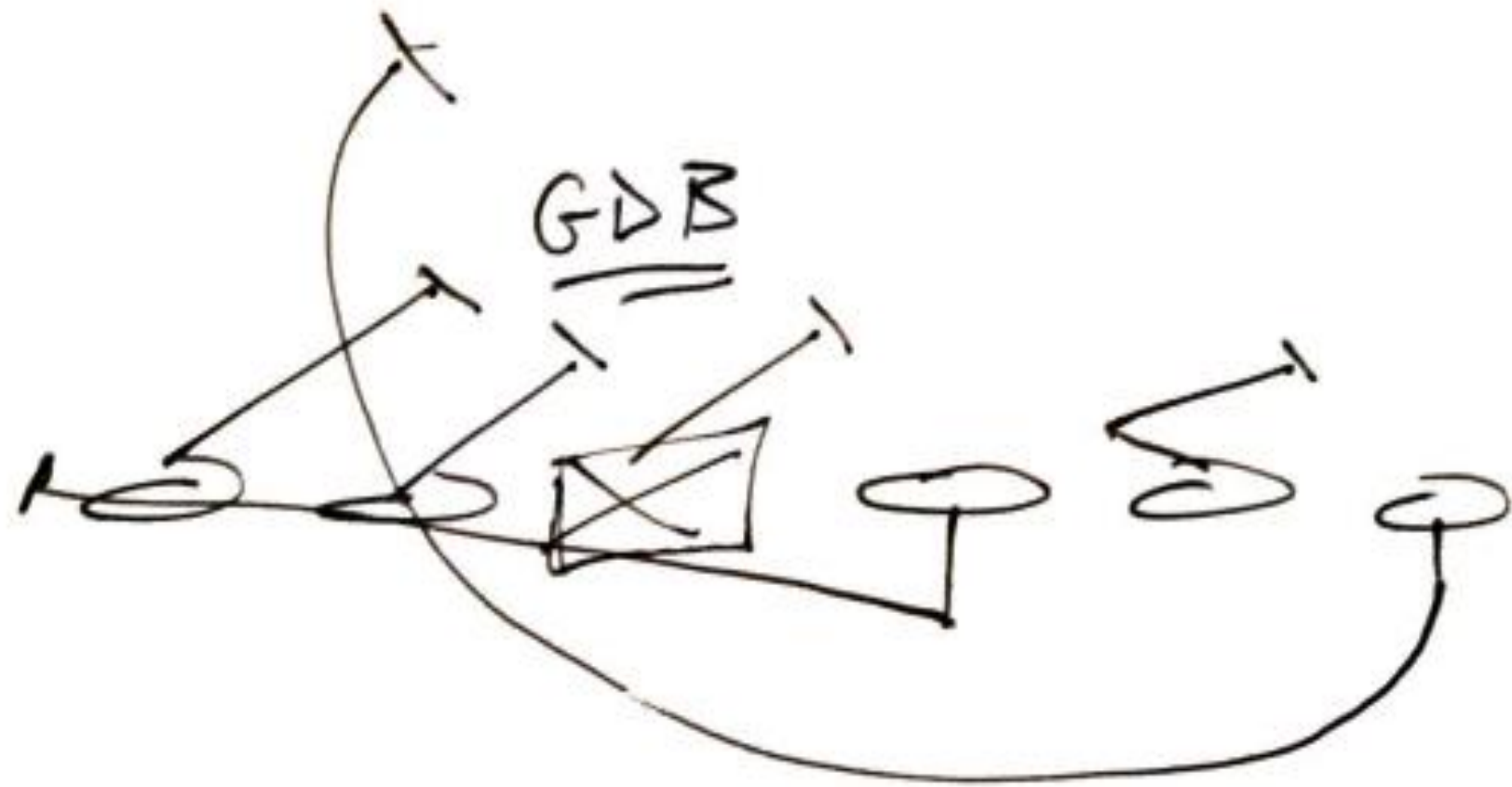

Maximizing the same blocking scheme

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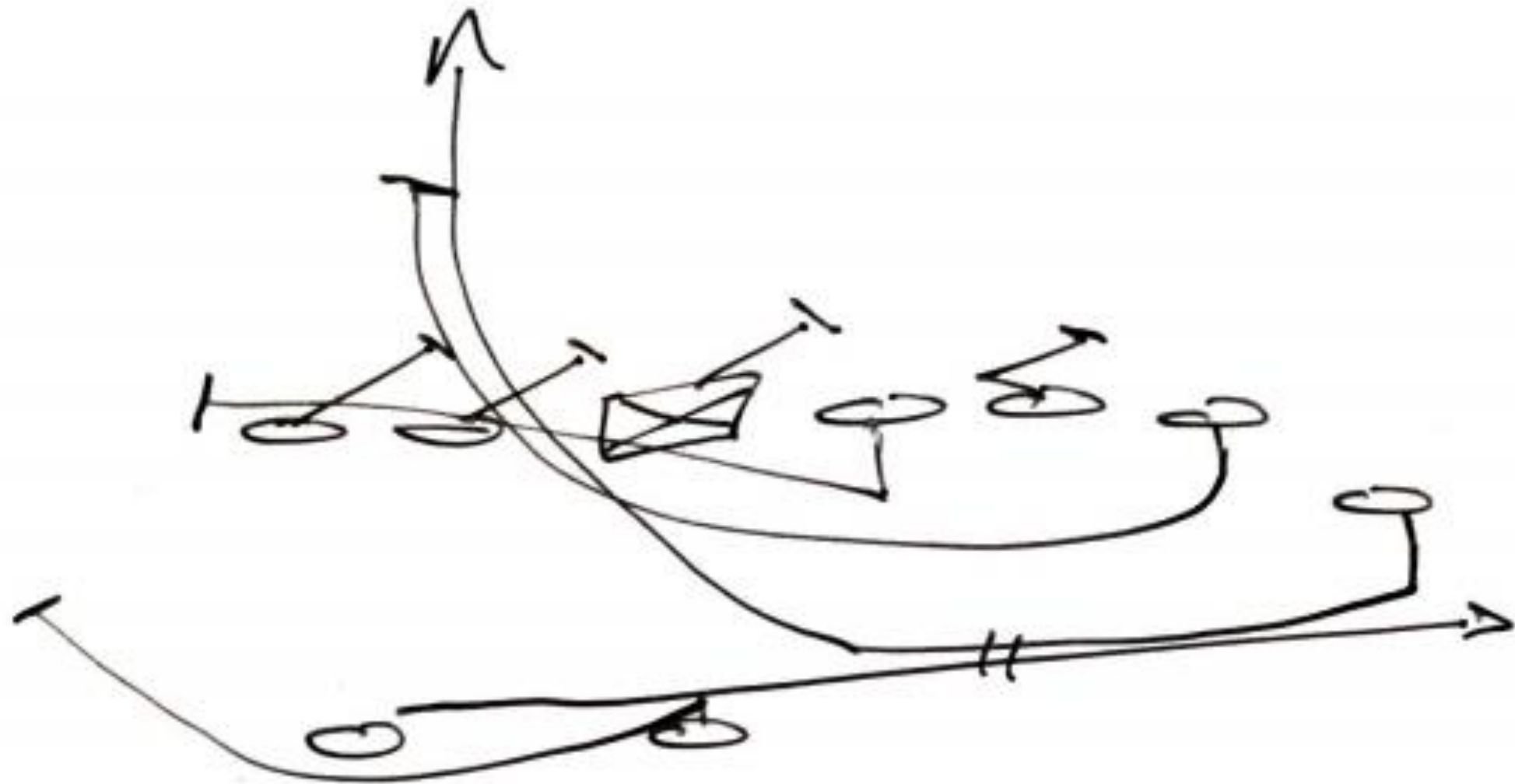
Blocking Rules Double Handoff

Blocking for Double Handoff –

- QT/QG/C all block Gap-Down-Backer
- SG will pull kick
- ST will step inside and hinge back
- TE Wraps with eyes inside

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Base Double Handoff

Backfield action for base –

- QB to RB is a “take” (RB takes ball with hands)
- RB heels should be on QB’s toes
- Wingback take a counter step and get depth
 - Should look like a game of chicken with RB and WB goes under at last minute
- QB will pick up edge player if desired by coach

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Other Versions

QB Read – We will read the 9 Tech in empty

Shuffle Version – If you are concerned on double handoff

Triple Option – We run with a bubble screen and shuffle pass

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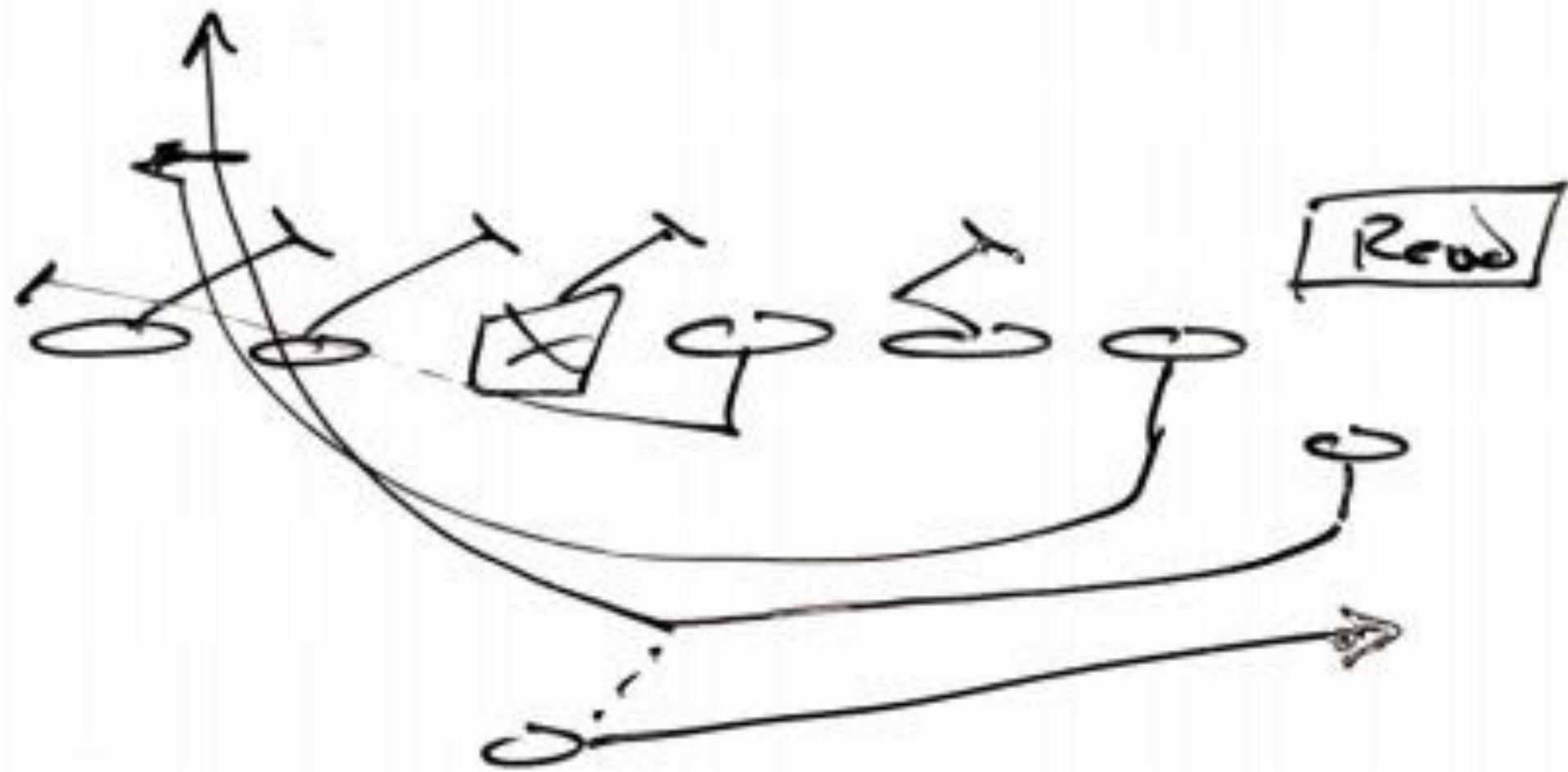
Other Versions

QB Read

- We run this play out of empty and read the “9” tech or OLB
- Often tag this with a single route to the TE/W side
- Can also tag with a “now” concept to the twins

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Other Versions

Shuffle Version

- We love this against man-to-man teams
 - Often they will follow the RB
 - We will run “Stay” call with TE if we think team is in man to man also
- Much “safer” version since it is a pass play

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Other Versions

Triple Option

- We love this concept against 3-4 teams that play us with a 4I to the quick side as it will put the OLB in conflict
- We read the OLB first – If he sits throw the bubble
- After him we get eyes to secondary fits and can pitch the shuffle

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
