Championship Culture

- Culture and character is an expression
- Of what you do, how you do it, and when you do it
- Building a championship culture is a direct reflection of the head coach and staff
- It promotes attainable goals while driving group behavior
- Culture creates an atmosphere that permeates and drives team's experience
- The following "Eight" characteristics are essential to sustained championship success

Introduction

- Having sustained championship success in any sport
 - Requires several different characteristics
- Establishing a championship culture is of upmost importance in how: • A team consistently functions and performs

Two Ways of Developing Team Culture

- Head coach can allow culture to emerge on its own
 - "Organic Approach"
 - Essentially the players create the culture
 - The "Top-Down Method"
 - Head coach leads the charge in a collaborative manner

1. Trust

- Honest, open, consistent, and direct communication
- Consistently expressing values, principles, and attitudes
- Being positive, proactive, and engaging

2. Core Values

A pillar of any culture

- Core values guide the decisions and choices
- When developing a Roadmap to championship success
- Core values dictate what is most important
- Many aspects need to be flexible and adaptive
 - Core values must be foundational and transparent

3. Clarifying the Purpose

- Imperative to understand each student-athlete's why
- Clarifying the purpose each year
 - Allows head coach and staff ability to adapt
 - A compelling purpose is the first layer
- 4. Vision
 - The blueprint for championship success
 - Complete understanding of where the program is now
 - Solid vision to inspire, mentor, encourage, motivate and teach
 - Developing championship habits
- 5. Principles
 - Culture can be a direct reflection of the leader
 - Our beliefs, values, character, opinions will become culture of program
 - Pay attention to the culture we want to build
 - Guidelines must be set in place
- 6. Team Chemistry
 - Team members should collaborate, share knowledge, communicate
 - Cohesion amongst group
 - Conflicts are inevitable
 - Not about conflict, but how group handles them / conflict can strengthen
 - Culture has real implications
- 7. Team-Oriented Goals
 - Student-athletes within program can develop own goals (have to be clearly defined)
 - Student-athletes need to believe goals are worthwhile and achievable
- Head coach and staff must create a culture that bring both collective & individual success
 8. Performance Standards
- Think beyond statistics
 - Important to invest time and energy to set and "Be" the standard of excellence
 - Student-athletes will feel implicit pressure to uphold the standard
 - Attitude is important as capabilities / with right attitude team can build capabilities
