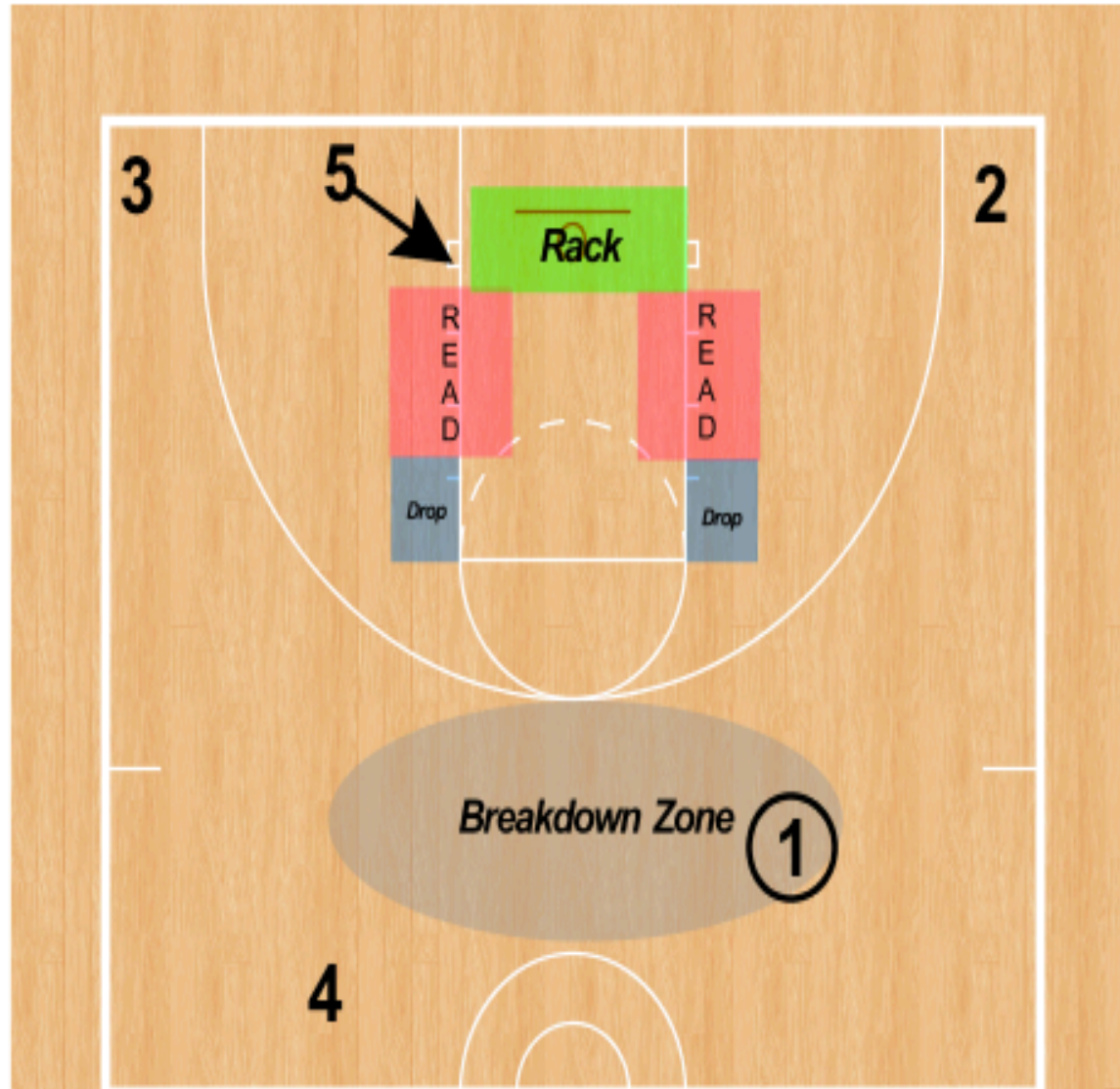


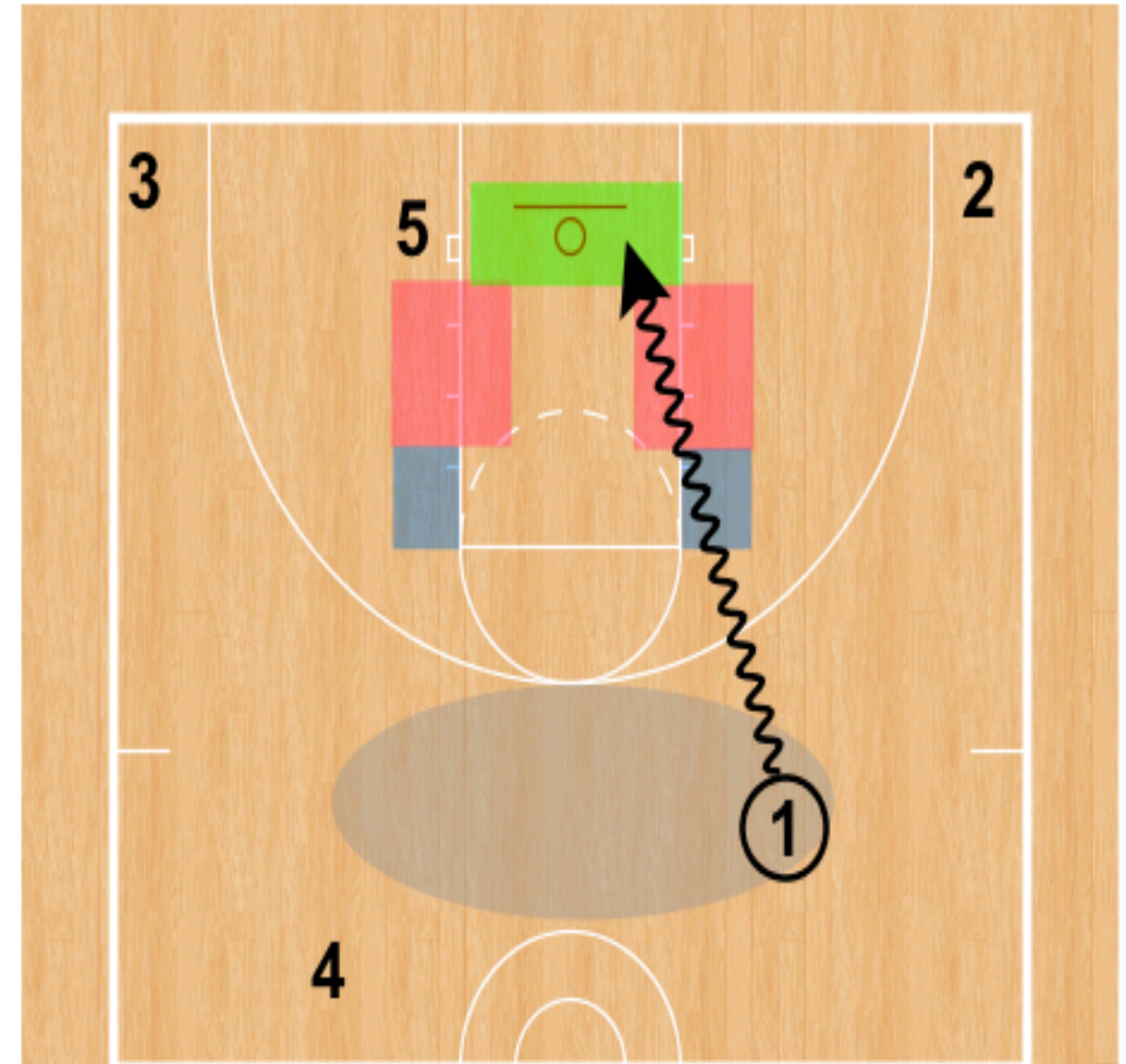
Basic Offense Basic Options In Offense



Notice the spacing is not like normal offenses. We should be in double gap, or even triple gaps with our spacing as much as possible. (we will cover this in the next section)

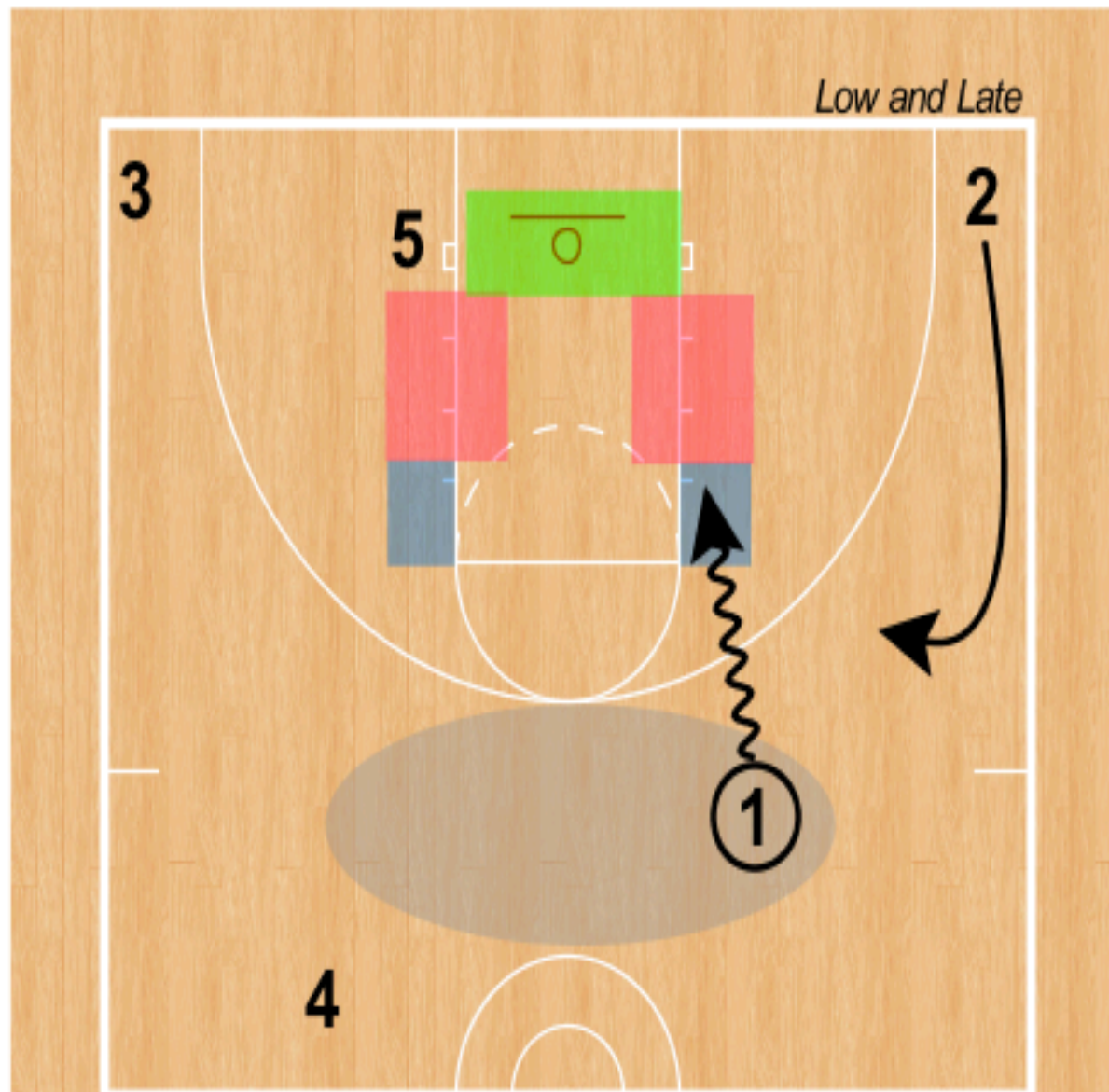
- O1 in the slot looking to get to the rim
- O2/O3 should be opposite in the corners (memorize the term low and late)
- O4 starts opposite the O1. If O1 has the ball they are on the opposite midpoint line, and slightly behind the ball.
- O5 opposite block

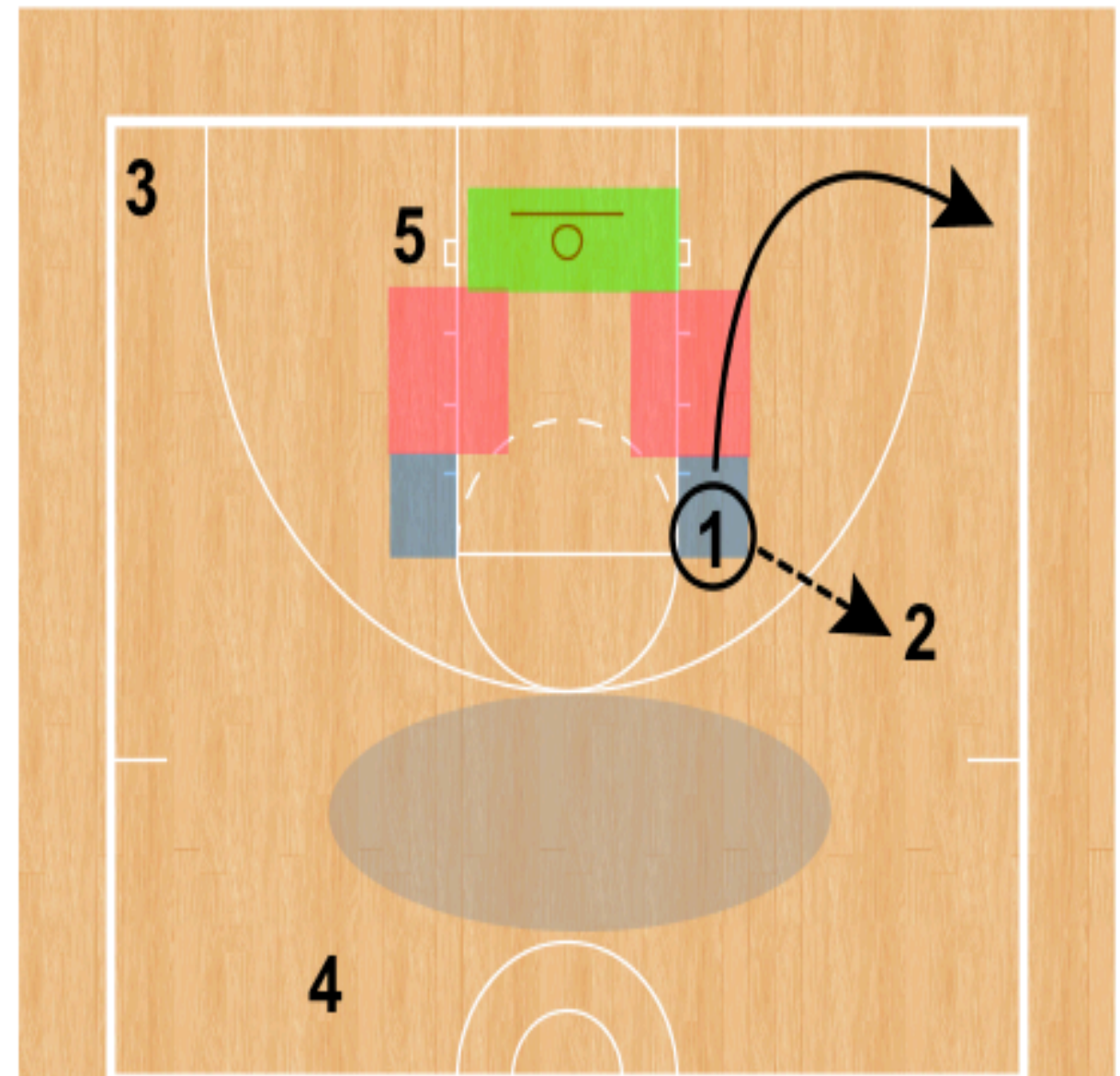


In the offense we really want the ball to get to the rim from the 1 off of dribble penetration. However we know that this isn't going to happen every trip. With that in mind, we have zones, and options as to what to do when in the offense.

As stated 1 is needing to get to the rack zone, but if they aren't able to do so, we want them to stop in the drop zone. **DON'T STOP IN THE READ ZONE!!!**

We can also penetrate to the 4 which would create a kickback situation.

But for this we will focus on the 2 side

2 doesn't leave until 1 picks up the ball. 1 will jump stop, face the sideline, and 2 will then leave. **Low and Late**
